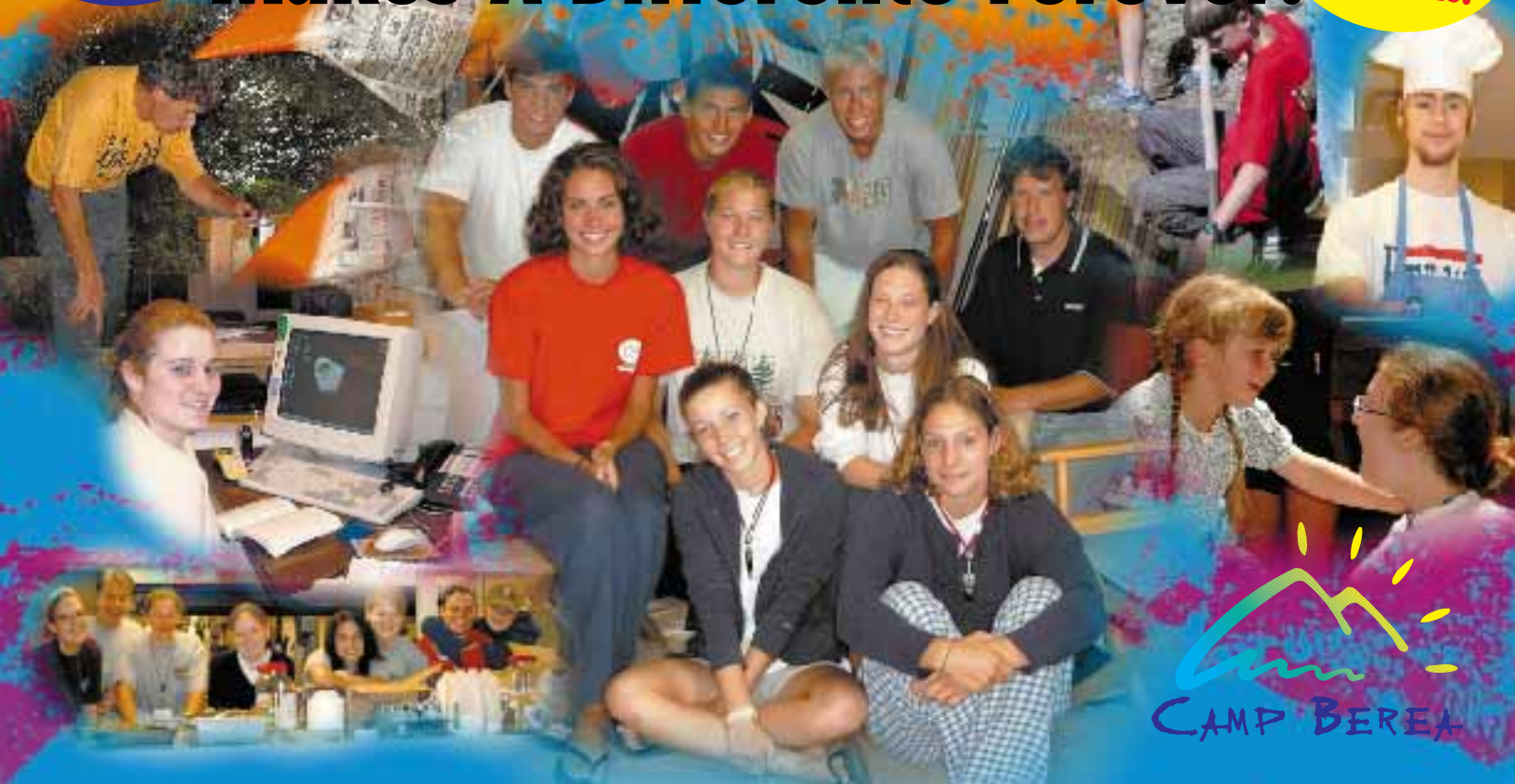

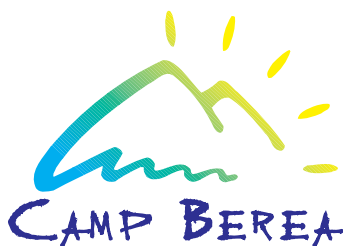

In Bristol: At the traffic light take Route 3A toward Plymouth. Follow 3A to blinking light, turn left onto West Shore Road (church on corner). Go 1.9 miles, turn right. Go 3.8 miles, turn right onto Berea Road and continue into camp.

About Camp Berea

Camp Berea's mission is to create and continuously

develop programs which appeal to children, teens, adults and families such that they respond to the message of Jesus Christ and the life-changing principles of God's word within the context of meaningful relationships and memorable experiences.

ACA Accreditation

The ACA accreditation certifies that Camp Berea operates according to all of ACA's high standards of health, safety, sanitation, personnel, and administration.

General Information

All staff are expected to counsel or work in other departments as the need arises. Summer staff training for high school students begins 6/15/03. For college students, please call. All who work through 9/1/03 receive a bonus. For those who have to start school earlier, bonuses are paid to those who finish their contracts. Staff will be assigned housing on-site and given one day off per week. Laundry facilities are available on-site. For non-USA citizens, proper work visas are required prior to date of hire.

Medical Insurance

There is no sickness coverage. For accidents, all claims are submitted to staff member's parent's, or guardian's insurance company first. Any deductible or unpaid balance may be submitted under Berea's limited access insurance policy. Accidents while working are covered under Worker's Compensation Insurance.

Season-Long Summer Staff Positions

Facilities Worker: Includes three areas of assignments (outdoor care, building cleaning and maintenance, and dining hall) that rotate with different shifts on a weekly basis. Duties include tasks like mowing lawns, repairing buildings, cleaning guest rooms, running the snack bar, and serving meals.

Cooks/Baker: One head cook is needed in addition to staff who will assist the cook and do the baking.

Kitchen Staff: These workers help prepare and serve food as well as cleaning the dishes and pots.

Full-time Counselors: 6 males and 6 females will be selected. Training provided in June. During Boys and Girls Camps, the opposite sex can choose vacation time or fill another role. Up to \$2400 income potential.

Volunteer Counselor: Some of Berea's counselors are volunteers for a week or two. Applicants must be at least 18 years old and may apply for any camp session.

Leadership Development

Camper (LDC): The LDC program is designed to give both classroom and practical experience in the basics of camp counseling. Applicants for Boys' or Girls' camp must be 15 years old. There will be a three year age difference between the LDC and the cabin of campers with which he/she is assisting.

Junior Counselor (JC): This program is for those who have completed the LDC program.

Waterfront Staff: Persons with a current lifeguard training certificate may apply for the position of Lifeguard. Those holding a current water safety instructor certificate may apply for the position of Water Front Director. Information on training and certification is available on request.

Sports/Challenge Course

Staff: High energy people who can lead games and organize sporting events are needed for this department.

The ability to teach various sporting skills and to assist counselors in providing meaningful recreational experiences for campers is essential. Instructor training for a large low ropes course will be provided. Certification will be provided if necessary.

Archery Director: Requires a background in range safety, equipment selection, and instruction. Training with the NAA can be arranged for an applicant with the proper background or interest.

Rifle Range Director: Requires experience with firearms and a current NRA instructor rating. Training for certification can be arranged for an applicant with the proper background or interest.





Craft Instructor & Assistant: Requires experience in arts/crafts.

Secretarial Assistants: Computer and typing skills are required. Good people skills are a must and phone experience is helpful.

Health Care: Physicians, RNs, LPNs, Physician's assistants and ARNPs may apply. Summer and weekly opportunities are available. Berea will help with local licensure. Responder to Emergencies and those with higher certification are also needed. Berea will provide training where needed.

Staff-In-Training: The SIT program provides an opportunity for teens who are 15 years or older to have a short-term staff experience. Over a 4-5 week period (including staff week), a variety of job assignments will expose the teen to the different areas of summer long work available. SITs will be trained as facilities workers, and they will receive daily assignments through the Facilities supervisor. A successful completion of the SIT program will enable the participant to be highly considered for a position on the summer staff of the next year. SIT participants are not paid, but will receive a valuable asset... experience!
