**Berea Ministries** is a non-profit camp and conference facility dedicated to changing lives for Jesus Christ. Its mission is to create and continuously develop programs which appeal to children, teens, adults, and families such that they respond to the message of Jesus Christ and the life changing principles of God's Word within the context of meaningful relationships and memorable experiences. In other words, Berea Ministries exists to help every person take their **next step with Jesus Christ**. The ministry is intentionally structured as a parent-child organization so that each family member—Camp Berea, Camp Monadnock, Camp Kerith, and Greenhouse—can best connect with, engage, and transform its unique constituency, furthering the parent organization's mission as effectively as possible.

**Camp Berea** is the founding site of Berea Ministries, which came into existence when over a dozen churches partnered together in 1945 to purchase the beautiful property on Newfound Lake's shores in Hebron, NH. Camp Berea (named after the Bereans who daily studied the Scriptures in Acts 17:11) is known for its high-energy, high-production programs that reimagine the ordinary. From its famous frappes to ever-changing slew of crazy camp games, Camp Berea provides a place for guests to immerse in life with others and leave reenergized.

**Camp Kerith** joined the Berea Ministries family in 2016. The property (formerly known as Camp Cherith, then Camp Cedarbrook) was gifted to Berea Ministries so the site could continue to be boldly stewarded as a place of spiritual rejuvenation and growth. Camp Kerith is named to honor both its history and to declare a trust in God by alluding to Elijah's time being sustained by God beside Kerith Brook. The rustic location on Bunganut Pond in Lyman, ME—a unique combination of spacious grounds and intimate nooks—honors the camp traditions of personal achievement and community. From the archery range to the campfire rings, attendees at Camp Kerith are inspired to grow as they are mentored and disciplined.

**Camp Monadnock** (formerly Monadnock Christian Ministries) was donated to Berea Ministries in 2021. Berea and Monadnock always shared the same mission (proclaiming the Gospel and building up the churches of the Northeast), so Berea Ministries finds it a privilege to again welcome home souls to this historical site in Jaffrey, NH, and to create an environment of belonging. Camp Monadnock, nestled at the foot of the famous Mount Monadnock, serves as a second home to thousands. The rocking chairs lining the 1800s porches quietly invite campers to slow down and enjoy time by themselves and with each other.

**Greenhouse** hosts one-day and weekend regional conferences for church leadership training and general spiritual renewal and discipleship. While Berea Ministries first ran offsite events for youth leaders in 2012, a pre-existing ministry called Greenhouse merged with Berea Ministries in 2015 to create the fruitful Greenhouse ministry known today. As suggested by the name, Greenhouse exists to create an intentional environment that cultivates relationships and spiritual growth. Rather than being grounded at any one physical location, Greenhouse conferences are hosted all over New England at different churches, bringing ministry and trainings right to the Church.

Berea Ministries can fulfill its mission only because of the dedicated prayerful and financial partnership of thousands of individuals and churches from New England and across the country. As a non-profit, the programs and conferences that Berea Ministries provides are not covered entirely by registration costs; rather, the ministry is able to faithfully carry out its mission due to people and organizations who share this Kingdom-minded vision.
